

WAIT LIST EXPLAINED



We understand the process of moving into a new home can be overwhelming. We aim to provide as much information as possible with transparency throughout our application process. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact our leasing office.

What determines my position on the wait list?

There are two important factors in determining your position - control date and priority.

How is a control date determined?

The control date is the date the application is completed with the Military Housing Office (MHO).

What are the different priorities?

After your control date is established, the next factor in your position on the wait list is priority. Refer to Chart 1.

Will my number go up and down?

Daily, new applications are processed and homes are leased, so your wait list number may often change. For the most up-to-date information on your wait list position, we encourage you to contact your leasing consultant.

When will I be offered a home?

Applicants will be offered a home as current residents provide a Notice to Vacate. Approximately 30-45 days prior to move in date.

What size home will I be offered?

Applicants will be assigned housing based on their rank and the number of occupants in the home. This rating comes from the Military Housing Office (MHO).

CATEGORY OF QUALIFIED APPLICANTS	PRIORITY LEVEL
Key and essential personnel, Wounded Warriors, Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) Priority.	1
Inbound active duty families	2
Active duty quarters to quarters	3
Active duty bachelors	4
Non-active duty	5
non-affiliated civilians	6

*Housing will be offered to single pregnant military personnel during their third trimester of pregnancy, subject to availability of housing. Service members in the process of obtaining command sponsorship will be housed as a Priority Level 2 applicant. *Reasons for move over include: increase in family size, promotion, medical need and convenience moves.
