

Fairbanks Community Food Bank

The Fairbanks Community Food Bank collects and redistributes donated food to individuals and agencies.

The Fairbanks Food Bank has several different Food Assistance Programs for the FNSB Community to include:

- Emergency Food Box
- · Food is Medicine
- Thanksgiving Food Box
- Christmas Food Box
- Bone Builders
- Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)
- Temporary Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

Emergency Food Box

The Emergency Food Box program allows for families to receive approximately 20 pounds of food per person in the house which is enough for three days. Families and individuals may receive up to 10 emergency food boxes per person per calendar year with a minimum three day wait period between each request. The Fairbanks Food Bank is unable to pack special requests – if there is an item in the box you are unable to eat, please share with a neighbor in need. All you need to bring is a photo ID for all adults (18 and older) as well as names and birthdates for children in the household included on your food box order. Must call between 10a.m and 12p.m.

The Fairbanks Food Bank is able to pack up to 60 orders each day. When they reach 60 orders for the day, they close the ordering time even if it is before noon on that day. Please call earlier rather than later. If you place an order but do not pick up your food box, you will be unable to receive further food boxes until you speak with the Fairbanks community food bank.

The Food is Medicine program provides six pounds of fresh produce a day, up to 30 pounds of fresh produce per person each week to those that are referred to the program. This program is available to local people of any age who are medically referred into the program.

Temporary Emergency Food Assistance Program

The Temporary Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP, USDA Commodities program) assists families who meet USDA federal poverty guidelines. Each month the Food Bank organizes about 50 volunteers to distribute food. Items include such staples as applesauce, dried beans, corn flake cereal, canned vegetables, etc. In addition to the 450-plus families who pick up the food at the Food Bank, the Salvation Army helps pack and deliver 100 boxes to local home-bound recipients.

If you would like to apply for TEFAP, please download the TEFAP program overview letter and the TEFAP application packet. The TEFAP brochure has additional information about the program. Please fill out the TEFAP application according to the letter of instruction included with the application. If you have any questions regarding the TEFAP program or the application, please contact the Fairbanks Community Food Bank.

Who is Qualified for TEFAP

You must qualify within the annual income guidelines.

- You must qualify EVERY October.
- Once you are qualified in October, you are eligible through the following September.
- You must pick up your box of food in person, presenting a photo ID card.
- If you are unable to pick up your box in person, a letter must be in the file prior to the distribution day and the designated person must present their photo ID.
- No casework will be done on the distribution day. If your paperwork is not on file, the volunteers who distribute the food will not give you a food box.
- Each household will only be served once a month.
- The quantity of food is limited to the verified household size. No exceptions and no exchanges of food.
- We cannot hold your box for distribution on any other day

WHEN? Third Saturday of each month WHERE? Fairbanks Community Food Bank, 725 26th Avenue, USDA warehouse end of the building (look for signs on the door.)

WHAT TIME? Opens no sooner than noon and closes no later than 2:00 pm. Last applicants accepted no later than 1:45 pm. Please plan for at least one hour, especially if you arrive at noon. The line is shorter at 1:00 pm.

WOMEN, INFANTS & CHILDREN (WIC) SUPPLEMENTARY FOOD PROGRAM

WIC Supplementary Food Program is a nutrition program that helps pregnant women, postpartum/breastfeeding mothers and young children under the age of 5 eat well, learn about nutrition, and stay healthy.

WIC provides check that can be used to purchase healthy foods such as:

- Whole grains
- Fruits and vegetables
- Milk or Soymilk
- Cheese
- Soy Milk
- Tofu
- Juice
- Eggs
- Cereal or oatmeal
- Beans-Either dried or canned
- Jarred baby food & Infant cereal after 6 months old
- Peanut butter
- Infant Formula

WIC is for all kinds of families: married & single parents, working and not working. if you are a father, mother, grandparent, foster parent or other legal guardian of a child under 5 years of age you can apply for your child.

- . You can participate in WIC if you:
- Live in Alaska AND
- Have a nutritional need (WIC staff can help determine this) AND
- Have a family income meeting WIC Income Eligibility Guidelines AND
- are one of the following client types:
- 1. Pregnant
- 2. Breastfeeding woman of an infant up to 12 months of age
- 3. Less than 6 months postpartum with a formulafed infant
- 4. Have a child under 5, including foster children

SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP)

The Alaska Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program provides food benefits to low-income households. The Division of Public Assistance issues SNAP benefits via the Alaska Quest card. **The amount a household receives** each month depends on the household's size and countable income. Eligible households use SNAP benefits to buy food products from authorized stores statewide.

Eligible applicants must pass income and assets tests. The gross monthly income test is based on 130% of the current Alaska poverty standard.

Alaska has special rules that allow for higher SNAP benefits in rural areas and the use of benefits to purchase certain hunting and fishing subsistence supplies.

FT Wainwright Wellness Center

The Wellness Center can assist with:

- Body Composition Analysis Various methods including the Bod Pod, ultrasound, bioelectrical impedance, or skinfold calipers are used to determine body fat percentage.
- Metabolic Testing- Results provide the exact number of calories required for weight loss, gain, or maintenance.
- Fitness Testing- An assessment of biometrics and the four components of health-related physical fitness: aerobic fitness, body composition, muscular fitness and flexibility. Results are used as a planning tool for exercise prescription and motivation to assist clients in establishing and meeting physical activity, fitness and health goals.
- Stress Management- Includes stress management and biofeedback sessions. With biofeedback, you're connected to a LED sensor that helps receive information about your body in real time on a screen in front of you.
- Educational Classes: Healthy Eating, Stress Management, Upping Your Metabolism and Sleep Education.
