Check the label if it says

WARNING! CAUTION! DANGER! POISON!

It may be hazardous.



Hazardous Household Waste

is defined as those materials found in residential waste, that would be regulated as hazardous waste if they were generated by industry.

A household product is hazardous if it is:

- Toxic: Poisonous or capable of causing acute illness
- Ignitable / Flammable: Ignites or burns easily
- Corrosive: Eats through other materials
- Reactive: Can explode if exposed to heat, air, water or shock

Some examples include:

- Automotive Fluids
- Lawn & Garden Care Products
- Hygiene Products
- Household Cleaners
- Paint & Paint Related Products
- Batteries
- Several Miscellaneous Items
