- Residents are required to move their bins back to the designated storage area the evening of pick up day of trash or recycling.
- Residents are required to schedule requests for bulk trash pick-up with the community center staff.
- Please contact your community center for questions regarding items that are not allowed for bulk pick-up.

Recycling Schedule

Recycling services will occur every other week and follow the same schedule as trash pickup, as outlined in the Trash and Bulk Pickup Schedule. (Effective August 4, 2025 recycling will occur the first and third week of each month)

Notes

Bins must be out by 7am on service days. If bins are not out on time we will service next service day to avoid delays.

There will be no scheduled service on Christmas Day (December 25th) and New Year's Day (January 1st). Services will be completed on a modified schedule for the week of the observed holiday and will be communicated prior to the holiday.

All other holidays, service will be completed as scheduled.





RECYCLING MADE EASY

To broaden the recycling program at Hickam Communities, we have provided each family with a 95-gallon blue recycling bin. Since items placed in the bins go directly to the recycling collection facility, no regular trash, bulk items, garbage, green waste or other refuse should be placed in them.

Also available to Hickam Communities' residents is the bulk item pick-up option that will take larger materials that generally do not fit into the recycling bins and are suitable for normal refuse disposal. See below for a list of acceptable recycling items and bulk pick-up items and go to www.opala.org for community disposal options for other disposal needs.

Base Recycling
