<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Number 1 - 7 plastic <p>To Prepare: Rinse bottles, Flatten if possible</p>	PLASTIC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastic grocery bags (can be returned to the store) • Frozen food or meat trays • Motor oil bottles • Polystyrene (Styrofoam) • Six pack holders and rings
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All food and beverage cans • Empty aerosol cans • Aluminum foil and aluminum baking tins <p>To Prepare: Rinse food cans, aluminum foil and baking tins to remove food particles</p>	METAL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paint cans • scrap metal - take to a scrap dealer • Aerosol cans that contain hazardous waste or are not empty. These items can be taken to Fort Drum Hazardous Household Waste collection. 315-772-6111
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All clear and colored glass food and beverage bottles and jars <p>To Prepare: Rinse bottles and jars</p>	GLASS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dishes and drinking glasses • Light bulbs • window glass • Auto glass • Mirrors • Pottery
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Milk and juice cartons • Drink boxes, aseptic packaging (broth, soup cartons, etc.) 	GABLE-TOP CONTAINERS	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All newspapers and inserts • Discarded mail and envelopes (with and without windows) • All magazines and catalogs • Gift, toy and tissue boxes • Office and school paper (any color) • Corrugated (grooved) cardboard boxes • Telephone books • Shredded paper • Pizza boxes • Cereal, soda or beer boxes • Mailing tubs • Paper towel/toilet paper rolls <p>To Prepare: Boxes should be broken down and no longer than 3ft in length. Do not bundle or tie with string or twine.</p>	PAPER PRODUCTS & CARDBOARD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paper towels • Paper plates • Hardcover books (unless cover is removed) • Non paper envelopes (including tyvek) • Paper with crayon writing • Packing paper that is padded or has a glossy finish • Gift wrapping paper • Corrugated cardboard with wax, metal backing or styrofoam backing
