<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All food and beverage cans</li> <li>• Empty aerosol cans</li> <li>• Aluminum foil and aluminum baking tins</li> </ul> <p>To Prepare: Rinse food cans, aluminum foil and baking tins to remove food particles</p>	<b>METAL</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paint cans</li> <li>• scrap metal - take to a scrap dealer</li> <li>• Aerosol cans that contain hazardous waste or are not empty. These items can be taken to Fort Drum Hazardous Household Waste collection. 315-772-6111</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All clear and colored glass food and beverage bottles and jars</li> </ul> <p>To Prepare: Rinse bottles and jars</p>	<b>GLASS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dishes and drinking glasses</li> <li>• Light bulbs</li> <li>• window glass</li> <li>• Auto glass</li> <li>• Mirrors</li> <li>• Pottery</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Milk and juice cartons</li> <li>• Drink boxes, aseptic packaging (broth, soup cartons, etc.)</li> </ul>	<b>GABLE-TOP CONTAINERS</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All newspapers and inserts</li> <li>• Discarded mail and envelopes (with and without windows)</li> <li>• All magazines and catalogs</li> <li>• Gift, toy and tissue boxes</li> <li>• Office and school paper (any color)</li> <li>• Corrugated (grooved) cardboard boxes</li> <li>• Telephone books</li> <li>• Shredded paper</li> <li>• Pizza boxes</li> <li>• Cereal, soda or beer boxes</li> <li>• Mailing tubs</li> <li>• Paper towel/toilet paper rolls</li> </ul> <p>To Prepare: Boxes should be broken down and no longer than 3ft in length. Do not bundle or tie with string or twine.</p>	<b>PAPER PRODUCTS &amp; CARDBOARD</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paper towels</li> <li>• Paper plates</li> <li>• Hardcover books (unless cover is removed)</li> <li>• Non paper envelopes (including tyvek)</li> <li>• Paper with crayon writing</li> <li>• Packing paper that is padded or has a glossy finish</li> <li>• Gift wrapping paper</li> <li>• Corrugated cardboard with wax, metal backing or styrofoam backing</li> </ul>

## TIPS:

- Dispose of yard waste beyond the property woodline. Please consider curb appeal and select an area not visible from residences or roads.
- Place recycling out ONLY on your designated recycling day. Ex. If your address is 84431B, you have an ODD recycling day because the last number of your address ends with an odd number.
- No plastic bagging of recycled items.
