Holiday Schedule

The following holidays will result in a change to regular pickup service.

New Year's Day Jan. 1	Memorial Day May 25	Labor Day Sept. 7

Please note inclement weather may cause a delay in service.

The table to the left is a schedule of trash collection days per neighborhood. Trash will be picked up weekly and recycling will be picked up biweekly, see chart above. Trash and recycle are subject to change.

Bulk items will be picked up per the schedule below. Bulk trash is any item that does not fit inside the provided bins.

Tuesday - Pierce Village, La Pointe, Erevia Park, Lee Park, Taylor East and West, McAuliffe Park (except Neary and Kline St), Barkers Court, New Hammond and Zahn Park.

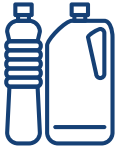
Thursday - Gardner Hills, Woodlands, Werner Park, Cole Park, Turner Loop, New Drennan, Drennan, Stryker Village, Harper Village, Summers Park, McAuliffe (Neary and Kline St only), and Hammond Heights.

Items that will not be picked up include: Motor oil, wet paint of any kind, large batteries, flammable liquids, freezers or refrigerators that still contain Freon, dirt, rocks, concrete and lawn mowers. Large items such as trampolines must be broken down. Tree branches must be 48 inches or less in length and tied in a bundle weighing less than 40 pounds.

Please be sure to have trash cans out to the curb early on trash day or the night before. Cans must be pulled back to the home on the same day trash is collected.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS FOR RECYCLING



PLASTICS

#1, 2, 4, 5, 7 Plastic Food & Beverage Containers ONLY. #3 and 6 plastics are *NOT ACCEPTED*. Please clean items before disposal!

Includes Bottles, Jars, Jugs, and Other Rigid Plastic Containers.



CANS

Includes aluminum cans, pie and baking pans, tin cans, steel food containers, EMPTY aerosol cans, and lids. Metal beverage cans, baking tins, foil, and food containers are also included in this material category. All items must be **CLEAN OF FOOD**.



CARDBOARD

Includes corrugated cardboard, shipping boxes, cereal and dry food boxes, shoe boxes, tissue boxes, moving boxes, detergent boxes, beverage/food cartons, and paper towel/toilet tissue rolls. All boxes **MUST BE FLATTENED** for proper disposal.



PAPER

Includes newspapers, magazines, brochures, paper back books, notebook paper (no backings), computer paper, paper bags, folders, phone books, greeting cards, regular/junk mail. Identify what is paper and what is cardboard before disposal.



NOT ACCEPTED

Styrofoam, **GLASS** of any kind, electronic waste (TVs & computers), clothing, motor oil & chemical containers, yard waste, shredded paper, plastic bags, ceramics/dishes, food waste, scrap metal, needles & medical waste, propane tanks, batteries.

All recyclable items need to be **LOOSE** and not bagged. Bagging these materials in black bags is **NOT ACCEPTABLE**.
